Breaktimes

During morning break, the children are offered free fruit and toast. They take their fruit outside with them.

Water is available throughout the day and we encourage the children to have a drink at appropriate times. Please ensure your child has a named **water bottle** in school everyday.

Reading

Reading is an important skill and we value it highly at school. Please make sure children brings their reading books into school **each day**.

We encourage you to listen to your child read at least **three times** a week and record this in their reading record. We can't emphasise enough the positive impact that regular reading at home has on children's overall progress across the curriculum.

Books are for enjoyment, as well as learning, so encourage reading as much as you can. **Talk** about what they've read, ask opinions, make predictions, visit the library and make sure your child sees you reading too.

Assessment

Our assessments are used to track children's progress. This ensures we are meeting their educational needs, and are making the expected progress.

Though SATS are now less formal and not compulsory for the government, we are still using them to inform children's attainment and progress levels. These will be administered in May/June time. So that the children are prepared and know what to expect, practise SAT papers are carried out each half term. They are done as part of a lesson so that the children do not feel on edge or worried about them.

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Where a child is not making expected progress in a particular area, we will put in place **interventions** to ensure they are receiving the support they need.

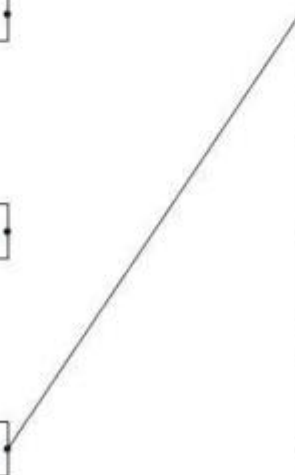

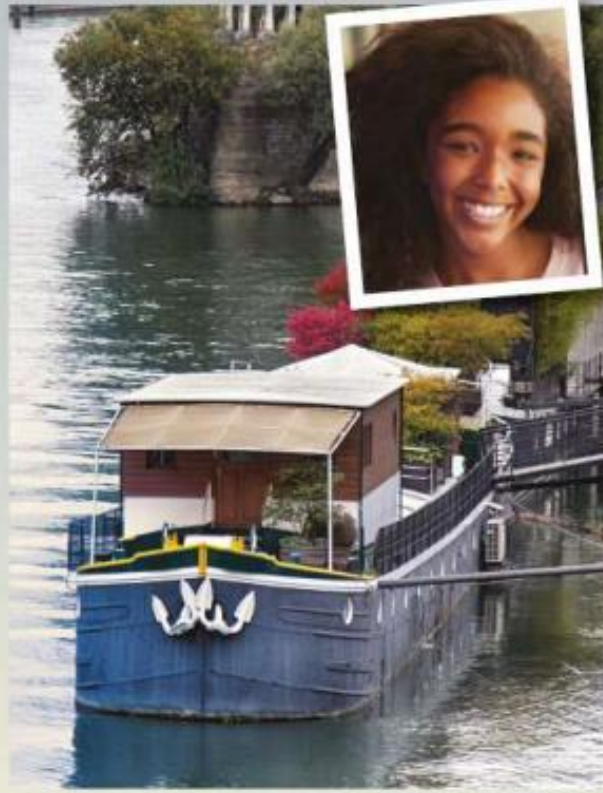

This term they will be doing Gymnastics and will have a PE session with MGFA on a Wednesday.

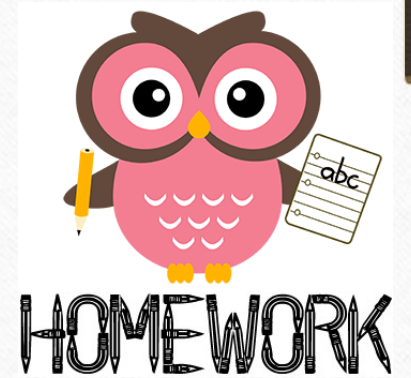
